

Columbine Gem and Mineral Society 2026 Field Trips (9/10/2026)

Field Trip Rules

All field trips are open to current members of the Columbine Gem & Mineral Society. All participants are required to sign a current Field Trip Rules, Safety and Release of Liability Document. This document is also required for minor children (under the age of 18) of club members, signed by the parent or legal guardian. GUESTS (adults or minors) are not permitted on field trips due to liability issues.

In all cases:

1. Members are required to: sign up for field trips ahead of the field trip (unless otherwise noted in the field trip description); notify the field trip leader(s) if they decide to not attend after signing up; & notify the field trip leader(s) if they need to leave the field trip site early.
2. PETS are not allowed on field trips. Please be aware that mine owners may have pets on their sites – CGMS cannot restrict those animals
3. RETURNING TO FIELD TRIP SITES: When a field trip takes place on private property/claim, club members may not return to the site without the explicit permission and authorization from the land or claim owner(s).
4. COLLECTING: Collecting specimens is for non-commercial personal use.
5. Attendees acknowledge they are guests on someone else's property and must act as such – any attendee may be required to leave a field trip location by the Field Trip Leader/Coordinator for any reason including safety, disrespectful behavior, lack of following directions, physical limitations, etc.
6. MINORS: No minors under 18 are allowed on field trips unless otherwise noted in the field trip description.
7. Initial sign-up will occur at CGMS meetings.
8. In ALL cases – You are responsible for yourself, you must be fit for the accessibility and limitations
9. Anyone who signs up for a spot and cancels less than 2 days prior to the trip may be asked to wait until the next field trip season to participate in future field trips at the discretion of the board; on trips with limits of 15 people or less, no shows will not be allowed on current year field trips.
10. Field Trip Leaders must enforce any limitations/restrictions provided to CGMS by mine-owners. On all field trips Field Trip Leader/s are empowered to set any limitations/restrictions they deem necessary.
